

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR CONTAINERS EMERGENCY REPAIR – REV.03

In order to ensure the safety of all personnel, as well as the environment preservation and protection, PORTONAVE informs the minimum requirements for registration and authorization of companies interested to provide container repair activities inside its facilities.

1. Structure Repair (dry and reefer):

- Workers must attend PORTONAVE's safety briefing program (valid for 01 (one) year);
- Provide to PORTONAVE the Work at Height certificate for all workers, as per Brazilian Ministry of Labor NR 35;
- Provide to PORTONAVE the Occupational Health Certificate for all workers, indicating fitness to Work at Height.

2. Reefer Machinery Repair:

- Workers must attend PORTONAVE's safety briefing program (valid for 01 (one) year);
- To provide the Federal Technical Registry – CTF (21 - 1 Cooling equipment repair or 21 - 3 Use of substances controlled by the Montreal Protocol);
- To provide the Basic Safety Training in Electricity Services certificate, as per Brazilian Ministry of Labor NR 10;
- To provide the workers PPE register (mandatory NR 10 protection clothes);
- To provide the responsibility declaration of compliance with the Montreal Protocol.

NOTE.1: *Minimum Personal Protection Equipment to access the terminal are: Safety helmet + chin straps; safety glasses; safety shoes; high reflective clothes or jacket.*

NOTE.2: *In case of Hot Works, the interested company must provide the Basic Safety Training in Hot Work Activities: General and specific module, according to the type of work (rotating machines, welding, blowtorch, cutting and gridding activity) according to Brazilian Ministry of Labor NR 34.*

IMPORTANT: *During reefer units maintenance, is forbidden to release of cooling gases in the atmosphere.*
